

**28<sup>th</sup> June 2017**

Minutes of the proceedings of the **Sandhurst Neighbourhood Action Group** held this day in the **Kitty Dancy Hall, Sandhurst Town Council** commencing at **9.02am** and finishing at **10.17am**.

**INTRODUCTIONS (Agenda Item 1)**

The meeting opened with a welcome from the Chairman and introductions around the table.

**MINUTES OF THE MEETING 5<sup>TH</sup> April 2017 (Agenda Item 3)**

It was proposed by the Chairman and the following was

that the Minutes of the Neighbourhood Action Group held on 5<sup>th</sup> April 2017 be received as a true and correct record and that they be confirmed and signed by the Chairman.

**NEIGHBOURHOOD POLICE REPORT (Agenda Item 4)**

- a) It was reported that there is a new Superintendent Shaun Virtue at TVP.
- b) PCSO Marie Graham advised that a lot of recent calls to the police have been concerning parking issues and neighbourhood disputes and that the majority of these are civil matters. Whilst a mediation session could be arranged most incidents are not police matters.
- c) There are continuing investigations into local vulnerable adults being exploited by drug dealers. One arrest was made and the accused received a custodial sentence.
- d) The overall reported crime rate has remained low.

**VEHICLE PARKING – TVP LETTER (Agenda Items 5)**

A letter concerning vehicle parking and the issuing of fines was considered by PCSO Graham as inappropriate to be putting on peoples cars. The actions stated on the letter are not practically enforceable by TVP.

**SID OUTCOMES (Agenda Item 6)**

There have been three sessions recently where the SID was used to monitor the speed of vehicles travelling in various locations. The findings were-

- a) Crowthorne Road – 68 vehicles speeds were recorded, 13 were above the 30 M.P.H limit.
- b) Greenways Longdown Lodge – 7 vehicles were monitored and the average speed was 19 M.P.H.
- c) Oak Way – 7 vehicles were monitored and the average speed was 18 M.P.H.

Therefore there will currently be no further actions.



### **PARKING ISSUES MONTGOMERY CLOSE (Agenda Item 7)**

The previous reported parking issue has improved and is now happening less frequently. It has also been confirmed that the grass verge which was previously discussed belongs to the house adjacent to it. There is no further action and therefore this item should be removed from the agenda going forward. The local resident may wish to continue to monitor and report any further issues to the Chairman of this Committee.

### **20 M.P.H. SIGNAGE – GREAT HOLLANDS (Agenda Item 8)**

It was reported that there are signs with Advisory Limit 20 M.P.H. being displayed on Great Hollands. Upon further investigation the signs are over 10 years old and are no longer issued in that format.

### **SPEED LIMIT ON A3095 (Agenda Item 9)**

Following a suggestion from a resident that the speed limit on the A3095 is reviewed it has been advised by BFBC that with the current development that is happening in the area it is likely that the infrastructure layout may change in the future and the speed limits will be reviewed at that time.

### **NEIGHBOURHOOD PLAN (Agenda Item 10)**

The Neighbourhood Plan has been put on hold currently whilst BFBC complete their Local Plan. The suggested site allocation from BFBC is due to be issued shortly. The next meeting will be arranged for late September 2017.

### **CYCLING UPDATE FOLLOWING BFC MEETING (Agenda item 11)**

It was reported that a meeting took place between BFBC, STC and a local resident. Cllr M Brossard has requested that his report on this meeting is included in the minutes as an attachment.

### **Q.A. SURVEY OUTCOMES (Agenda item 12)**

1800 residents throughout the Borough were contacted for the recent resident's survey. The results were favourable and showed that 96% of residents felt that the local people from all backgrounds got on well together. Sandhurst was voted the best place to live out of all the local parishes.

### **TESCO EXPRESS POTHOLE (Agenda item 13)**

It was reported that Cllr M Brossard has written to the area manager of Tesco concerning the potholes but has not yet received a reply. It was confirmed that the road is unadopted and therefore not the responsibility of BFBC. Further to discussion it was proposed by Cllr M Brossard and the following was

that a letter would be sent to the CEO of Tesco.

### **ANY OTHER BUSINESS (Agenda item 14)**

- a) A request for the SID to be used in Branksome Hill Road was received and will be considered.
- b) It was reported that Southern Gas Networks imminent roadworks in College Road will mean that residents will be unable to park their cars in their drives whilst parts of the road are inaccessible. This may cause some disruption to residents as an increase in cars parked on local roads is likely throughout this period.



- c) An update on the Rackstraws signage was requested. Cllr M Brossard confirmed that this is an ongoing matter.
